Student Drop Off Reminder :



Our doors open at 8:20 each morning for students being dropped off by parents. Students who eat breakfast at school should be dropped off between 8:20 and 8:25. Students arriving after 8:35 must enter through the main doors and be signed in at the office by a parent as the students are considered **tardy after 8:35**. Help Wanted:

Monroe Local Schools is looking for members of the Monroe Community who are interested in serving as a Surrogate Parent to assist in making educational decisions for students with disabilities. Surrogate Parents are appointed to act on behalf of students with disabilities that are foster-placed into out community and will represent the student's interest in meetings involving the student's special education program. To become a Surrogate Parent, individuals must successfully complete the Surrogate Parent training and be appointed by the Superintendent of the local school district. Federal and state statutes prohibit employees of a public agency involved in the education or care of the child (e.g. local school district, any county service agency) from serving in the role of Surrogate Parent. Training will be held at the Center for Regional Educational Services in Reading, Ohio on February 28, 2009; you are only required to attend one session. State law prevents us from providing compensation for surrogate parent services, but the district is permitted to reimburse for mileage to and from meetings.
